

Important Facts about the Lucas County Senior Services Levy

Lucas County is experiencing unprecedented growth in its senior population (age 60+). In 2000, Lucas County had 76,180 seniors. In 2020, the number of Lucas County seniors is projected to reach 101,899. During the course of the projected next Senior Levy (2020-2024), the number of Lucas County seniors will reach 108,382.

Vote for Issue 8 Senior Services Levy on November 5

Fact: This is a renewal of the current Senior Services Levy for 0.60 mill which expires on December 31, 2019, with a modest 0.15 mill increase.

Fact: The annual cost to the owner of a \$100,000 home will be \$22.52. For an additional \$4 a year, you can help seniors stay independent and live at home.*

Fact: The length of the levy will be 5 years.

Fact: The current levy serves more than 331,000 home-delivered meals; 12,000 hours of home care; 3,600 days of Alzheimer's day care for seniors with Alzheimer's disease and dementia; 6,000 units of chore services and 38,000 transportation trips for seniors.

Fact: The proposed renewal of 0.60 mill Levy with a modest 0.15 mill increase will provide the following:

- Meals to homebound and frail elderly
- Homecare services to help Lucas County seniors remain independent and at home
- Services for persons with Alzheimer's Disease and dementia and their caregivers
- Medical transportation, home modifications, senior center services/facilities and chore services
